Fun Facts on Phoenix

Phoenix originated in 1886 as a hay camp to supply Camp McDowell.

The amount of copper on the roof of the Capitol building is equivalent to 4,800,000 pennies.

Phoenix averages 7.64 inches of rain, and Yuma's annual average is 3.27 inches. Phoenix averages 211 days of sunshine per year. An additional 85 days per year are only partly cloudy, leaving an average of only 66 days of cloudy or rainy days.

The Phoenix airport, called Sky Harbor International Airport, is the sixth busiest airport in the country.

South Mountain Park covers more than 25,000 acres, making it the largest city park in the world.

Phoenix is not only a city in Arizona, it is also a city in New York, Maryland and Oregon.

In 1933, architect Frank Lloyd Wright's studio, Taliesin West, was built near Phoenix.
