


XX Boundary Limits with Boundary Elms. Elms were very numerous in and around the Borough. Nearly 1000 Elms and 40 Ashes were growing on Corporation land alone in the year 1582. There were then some 70 barns and malt houses. The population of the Parish was about 3000, of whom about 2000 lived in the Borough.
