

Cartographer's Notes: As a result of the last cataclysm, circa 322aV, and the subsequent rising sea levels in the northern reaches of the Sea of Agasan, the Hallorvian coastline has shifted in some cases dramatically from the original charters. Since the maps were last charted, abundant reefs have grown. Many of these reefs are not marked on charts predating the last Age. Coastal maps dated prior to 322aV should not be used when sailing the Sea of Agasan off shore of Hallorvia.

Sailors have reported unseasonable rough seas on the crossing between Hallorvia and Devon in the winter months, especially around 39° 9' N. Captains are advised not to attempt this crossing in the dark months of winter. Sea conditions can be variable and storms severe.

The Empire has received numerous reports of sea snakes infesting the waters surrounding the islands off the coast of Hallorvia. As this archipelago includes numerous uncharted isles, it has been difficult to confirm sightings.

Captains are advised to set course north of the Jamarian isles or pay ransom to pirates.

On the Kingdoms of Myacene, Avatar and Vest and travel between the Middle Kingdoms and the East: The waters of the Fire Sea are navigable along the coastline of the Middle Kingdoms paying regular heed to wind and weather. Storm surges are likely during the deep winter months along the north Saldrian coast and all of Dannym and Monacene.

Care must be taken when sailing the coastline off the Eastern Kingdoms, as sulfuric geyers and vertices are often reported, along with other volcanic disturbances along this unstable coast. Monacene is particularly dangerous at the 45th parallel, where electrical storms spawned by the consistently active volcano of Mt. Veal have been known to generate cyclones several miles wide.

At the time of this charting, the Slave Trade is active between Avatar, Vest and the Forsaken Lands. Ships suspected of piracy and kidnapping are known to ply the southern waters of the Fire Sea. Captains are warned to inn armch and must be ready to fend off attack at all hours of the watch.
