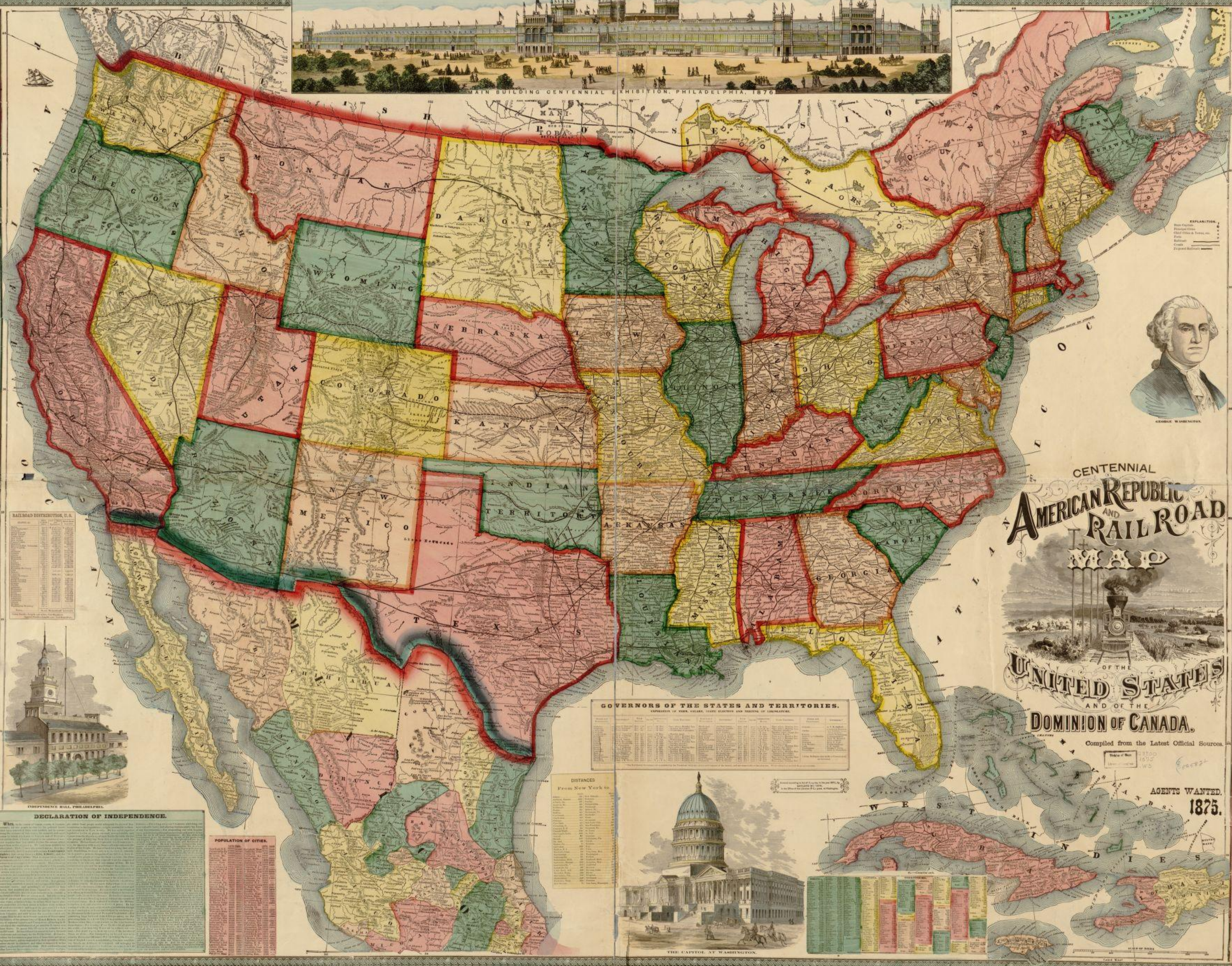

DECLARATION OF INDEPENDENCE.

When the course of human events has so completely altered the former position of the Colonies, that it is necessary to declare their independence of Great Britain, and to assume among the Powers of the Earth, the separate and equal station to which the Laws of Nature and of Nature's God entitle them, a decent respect to the opinions of mankind requires that the reasons which have led to this declaration should be explained to the world.

We the Representatives of the United States of America, in General Congress assembled, do hereby declare that these United States are, and of right ought to be, free and independent States; that they are absolved from all allegiance to the British Crown, and that all political connection between them and Great Britain is, and ought to be, totally dissolved; and that as a free and independent State, they have full power to levy war, conclude peace, contract alliances, establish commerce, and to do all other acts which States of equal power may do.

In witness whereof, the Representatives of the United States of America, in General Congress assembled, have hereunto set their hands and seals, at the City of Philadelphia, this fourth day of July, 1776.
