



SOUTHAMPTON STATION

Southampton Central is the city's main train station. For services to London, Winchester, Portsmouth enter via the main entrance from the North (Southbrook Road) and trains run from Platforms 1 & 2.

For trains to the New Forest, Bournemouth and Salisbury, enter via the Southern entrance (Western Esplanade) and trains run from Platforms 3 & 4

- CITY HERITAGE TRAIL**
- 1 GOD'S HOUSE TOWER** **G5**
Once home to the city's town gunner, the tower has seen a number of uses in its lifetime.
 - 2 THE WOOL HOUSE** **F4**
Built in the late 14th Century as a storehouse for wool waiting to be exported to Italy, it has been an important feature of Southampton's waterfront for nearly 700 years.
 - 3 MEDIEVAL MERCHANT HOUSE** **F4**
The house has been restored to its original 14th Century appearance. Why not stop in at Metricks on the High Street for a coffee.
 - 4 TUDOR HOUSE AND GARDENS** **F4**
15th Century timber framed museum in the heart of Old Town. The house and gardens have been recently restored. (See overleaf for info)
 - 5 SAINT MICHAEL'S CHURCH** **F4**
The oldest building in Southampton, dating back to 1070.
 - 6 THE RED LION** **F5**
12th Century pub, the oldest in Southampton
 - 7 HOLYROOD CHURCH** **E**
Just outside the church is the QE2 anchor.
 - 8 BARGATE** **D5**
Constructed in 1180, the Bargate served as the main point of entry to the city.
 - 9 MEDIEVAL WALLS** **D4**
The original borders of the city. Walk along the remains of historic towers, medieval stairs and through the heart of the Old Town.
- TITANIC TRAIL**
- 1 OCEAN VILLAGE** **G7**
The main dockyard in 1912, where tug boats would have pulled the Titanic out to sea
 - 4 CANUTE CHAMBERS** **F7**
Local offices of the White Star Line.
 - 4 SOUTH WESTERN HOUSE** **F6**
Originally a grand hotel, built in 1872. Ship designer, Thomas Andrews, and J Bruce Ismay, owner of White Star Line, both stayed here.
 - 4 ADMIRALTY HOUSE** **G6**
In the 1920s, this served as the post and telegraph office to the dock.
 - 5 THE GRAPES PUBLIC HOUSE** **F6**
Popular with engine room workers. Original photos and a framed blueprint are on the walls.
 - 6 THE WHITE STAR TAVERN** **F6**
Now a gastro pub and boutique hotel, many second and third class passengers stayed here.
 - 7 THE PLATFORM TAVERN** **G5**
Had great views of the Titanic before she left.
 - 8 ST JOSEPH'S CHURCH** **F4**
Here you can find a memorial dedicated to the staff of the Ritz, one of the restaurants onboard.
 - 9 HOLYROOD CHURCH** **E5**
Built in 1320, destroyed during WW2, now a memorial for Southampton's merchant seamen.
 - 10 THE CIVIC CENTRE** **B4**
Here you will find The Titanic Postal Workers Memorial and Book of Remembrance.
 - 11 SEACITY MUSEUM** **B4**
See main entry on opposite page.
 - 12 THE ENGINEERS MEMORIAL** **A5**
Memorial to the men who kept the ships power going during her final hours.
