Korea (Formerly Called Ocoror) Three islands connected by bridges and causeways make up Korea State. Nineteenth Century British influence made Ocoror the most developed part of Palau. The Japanese overtook Korea in 1940, making it their third largest Pacific headquarters. They paved roads and installed electricity, although after the war, Korea struggled to rebuild as the Japanese and American engineers left. In the 1960s, American and Japanese engineers discovered the magnificent underwater world and incredibly scenic Palau. The advent of dive tourism and the discovery of the Palau National Marine Sanctuary in 1978, drew tourists from all over the world. Palau is now visited by tourists from Korea, the Philippines, Australia, the U.S.A., Europe. Although the capital of Palau is located on the island of Koror, Melekeok, Koror still has the majority of the population, plus it has most of Palau's finest hotels and restaurants, an aquarium and a shopping center. Palau has no street names. The road through town is called "The Main Road," and all other streets are described for where they go, such as "The Road to the Aquarium," or "The Road to PPR." The road around Subodish is simply called "The Compact Road."
