Shinagawa thrived in the Edo Era as the first post town of the former Tokaido road. These days, after the seaside redevelopment, it is getting attention as an area of new attractions.



## Epson Aqua Stadium

エプソン 品川アクアスタジアム B-2

This indoor entertainment complex houses an aquarium (about 10,000 marine animals of about 350 species) and a variety of entertainment spots including restaurants. There are four attractions supported by the cooperation of manga artist Matsumoto Leiji.

- 2-min. walk from JR/Keihin-Kyuko line Shinagawa Sta. (Takanawa Exit)
- Monday-Fridays: 12:00-22:00 Saturdays: 10:00-22:00, Sundays and holidays: 10:00-21:00 \*Open hours may vary according to the season.

## Sengakuji Temple

泉岳寺 A-2

The Soto School temple was built by Tokugawa Ieyasu in 1612. It is known as the burial ground of the FortySeven Loyal Retainers. There are a bronze statue of Oishi Kuranosuke and graves of the loyal retainers.

- 1-min. walk from Sengakuji subway Sta.(A07) on Toei Asakusa Line
- April-September: 7:00-18:00 October-March: 7:00-17:00 \*Akogishi Memorial Hall 9:00-16:00 (time of admittance)

## Hara Museum of Contemporary Art

原美術館 C-2

Exhibitions of contemporary art are held 5-6 times a year at the private home-turned-museum. The café facing the garden and the museum shop are also popular.

- 15-min. walk from JR/Keihin-Kyuko line Shinagawa Sta. (Takanawa Exit), 3-min. walk from the Gotenyama stop on Toei Bus for Gotanda Station from JR/Keihin-Kyuko line Shinagawa Sta. (Takanawa Exit)
- 11:00-17:00 (last admittance 30 minutes before closing)
- \*-20:00 on Wednesdays (excluding national holidays)
- Monday (or the following day when it falls on a national holiday), exhibition renewal period, New Year holidays
- Adult ¥1,000, college/high school student ¥700, elementary/junior high school student ¥500 (An entrance fee may be charged for using only the shops and cafes.)

## Houseboat (Shinagawa-ura)

Shinagawa-ura and the houseboat have been chosen by the residents as 2 of the 100 sights of this town. The jetty for fishing boats and houseboats allows Shinagawa to still retain the air of a fishing town.

## Tennoz Isle

天王洲アイル C-4

An urban resort looking over the ocean. The boarded promenade circling the isle is popular for relaxation.
