DISCOVERIES MADE BY THE ROYAL ADMIRAL.
 Reef and Breakers off the North-west end of New Caledonia: This is a most dangerous Shoal, and the water so very smooth, owing no doubt to its eastern course, that a ship might be on the Reef presently, and almost with the best look out the Longitude of 162. North west course, 13 1/2. 38. from London, and the Latitude 18. 4. South. 17. 5. 38. East.
 Barings Isles are two small Islands very low, covered with trees, and which seem joined by a Reef; they lie in Latitude 8. 38. North. Longitude 168. 8. East. 17. 5. 38. East.
 Muskitoe Group consist of about 20 small Islands, well covered with trees, and of which the largest is only 1/2 a League in length, and 1/4 in breadth, and is situated in Lat. 7. 30. N. Long. 168. 30. E. East. 17. 5. 38. East.

OBSERVATIONS ON THE WALPOLE'S TRACK.
 The Walpole was set from the Cape of Good Hope to Van Diem's Land, 12 1/2 to the Eastward. From Van Diem's Land to Norfolk Island, 0 47 to Ditto. From Norfolk Island to the Isle of Ruyter, 5 30 to the Westward. From Ruyter to the Island of Formosa, 3 25 to Ditto.
 It was Capt. Butler's intention to have passed through between New Caledonia and the New Hebrides, but on discovering Walpole Island, and Durand's Reef and Breakers, he heaved again to the Eastward, and since his return he finds there are in that Passage many divers Durand's Reef and Breakers are in Lat. 22. 46. S. and Long. 169. 02. E. (Northernmost or Arthur's Isle,) in Lat. 24. 11. S. and Long. 161. 23. E. Southernmost or Parry's Isle,) in Lat. 22. 29. N. and Long. 167. 52. E. London, 19th May 1791.
